ABOUT THE PERFORMANCE

Let's draw. Here is a line. Here is a circle. And the belly button. Look at me. I roll. I go up. I go down. Oops. Again. Let's play. Catch me! You made it. I made it. We can. We could ... We are great!

Doodledee it's me! is a playful and poetic visual dance-theatre performance for the little ones. Doodledee is a study of how young children perceive themselves at different stages of their development. They grow and become more conscious of their bodies. It is essential to support the growth of a healthy body self-esteem. The performance is visually based on children's drawings of themselves during the first six years of their lives. The performance is a story of self-discovery: I am. I can. It is an ode to the body – inspiring and admiring.

ABOUT THE AUTHOR

The AEIOU, The Theatre for Babies and Toddlers is an independent group of artists, founded by Katja Kähkönen, Mateja Ocepek and Katja Povše in Slovenia in 2010 and 2013 in Finland. The AEIOU group creates visual and physical theatre, as well as object theatre, where theatre arts are intertwined with other forms of art.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

1. STAGE REQUIREMENTS (provided by the venue):
Black box, black dance floor. Actors are wearing socks only.
We can do without the dance floor, but black, high quality floor, appropriate for dancing barefoot, is a must.
Minimal size: 10 x 8m.

Setup time 4 hours, Teardown time 1 hour. If we perform in the morning/before noon, setup should be done the previous day.

Set consists of two wooden stage platforms, ca. $1 \times 2m$ and $1 \times 3m$.

Actresses use big zorb, various balls and many plush and foam toys.

- 3. SOUND REQUIREMENTS (provided by the venue):
- FOH
- Monitoring system on stage
- 2x CD player
- 4. LIGHT REQUIREMENTS (provided by the venue):
- Programmable mixing board
- Appropriate number of dimmer channels (most of the lights can be coupled in pairs)
- Dimmable audience light
- PC (or fresnell) general front and general back light
- Few soft spots (see the appended lightplan)

Lights and sound are operated by a single person.

At the end of the performance audience is invited onto the stage.
